## IN 2020, WE...

#### **EXPANDED OURSTAFF TO INCLUDE ASSOCIATE PROGRAM DIRECTOR, KAMMI RISPER**

In October, Thrive announced the hiring of Helena, Arkansas native Kammi Risper as Associate Program Director. In this role, Kammi coordinates Thrive's youth engagement programming with local students, educators, and community partners. She fills this important role for Thrive, bringing an engaging personality, vital relationships, and a fresh spirit to the work. Kammi notes, "[Working with] Thrive has been a great opportunity for me to build positivity in my community. I enjoy the atmosphere and look forward to the change we'll make in the future together, adding to what's already done."



#### HOSTED AN AMERICORPS NCCC TEAM FOR TWO WEEKS

In January, Americorps National Civilian Community Corps members were stationed in the Delta, and participated in the preparation and creation of one of Thrive's largest murals to date. The existing wall of Grace Food Pantry required much work prior to the application of paint, and the Americorps team was up to the task! Working alongside Thrive staff and student program participants, this corner was transformed, bringing visibility and vibrancy to this local nonprofit's facility. Americorps volunteers also worked with Thrive staff to complete a mural at one of our favorite State Parks - the Delta Heritage Trail State Park, where their work was unveiled in time for the Governor's visit in January.



#### ADAPTED OUR YOUTH PROGRAMS INTO WEEKLONG WORK-SHOPS WITH COVID-19 SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

When it became apparent that the pandemic would completely change instructional models for area students, Thrive chose to pivot our youth programming to alternative delivery methods, first to online platforms, then to concentrated weeklong workshops where students could work outdoors, be safely masked, and complete projects within a condensed amount of time. The result has been the completion of some of our most exciting projects to date, including 5 murals since June and further development of the Harbor View Trail! As our new programming model shifted to weeklong workshops, we found greater flexibility for student attendees and had 30+ student participants.





#### PAINTED 7 MURALS IN PHILLIPS COUNTY

The year 2020 was a transformational



year for the walls and streets of our communities! Thrive Design Crew students participating in our workshops completed 7 mural projects in Phillips County which included: a bike mural at the Delta Heritage Trail State Park; a Delta Foods creation at the Grace Food Pantry; "I am the Future" at Kids for the Future in Helena; 2020 Census signs placed around Helena; "Catfish Corner" on Columbia Street; a crosswalk on our beloved Cherry Street in Downtown Helena; and multiple environmental installations of Delta wildlife on the Harbor View Trail!

#### WERE NOMINATED FOR TWO ARKANSAS TOURISM AWARDS

A project led by Thrive Design Crew students in partnership with the Mississippi River State Park superintendent Kristina Root to produce a promotional video for the park was nominated for an Arkansas Delta Byways Tourism Association award. Valisecia, the student heading up the project, attended the awards event with the Thrive Team in Wynne in February. Soon after, Thrive attended the State of Arkansas Henry Awards dinner in Fort Smith in early March as a nominee for this same project promoting tourism and the work of our local State Park.



#### BEGAN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE USDA, WINROCK INTERNATIONAL AND THE UAMS SPAN PROGRAM TO CREATE OUTDOOR ASSETS

Thrive was included as a service provider and local community partner in a grant from the United States Department of Agriculture administered by Winrock International with guidance from the The University of Medical Sciences, State Physical Activity Network. This grant will continue into 2021 to support the planning, design, and implementation of creative placemaking initiatives in the rural communities of Helena-West Helena, Lonoke, Stuttgart, and England, Arkansas. We are incredibly grateful to Linsley Kincade and her team at Winrock International and Leesa Frasier at UAMS SPAN as they work to uplift our communities with an emphasis on outdoor activity, health and creative experiences.







### CREATED A 1 MILE HIKING & WALKING LOOP IN THE HELENA RIVER PARK

This summer, Thrive took a major step toward the creation of the Harbor View Trail in the Helena River Park. In development for several years, beginning with a student service project in 2017, the digital maps became reality as mowers, rakes, and saws were deployed to clear the path this year! The creation and maintenance of the pathway is an on-going project, soon to be augmented by way-finding signage and the appearance of woodland creatures painted by Thrive Design Crew students. Local residents and tourists can now experience this ever-evolving nature trail within walking distance of downtown Helena.

#### STARTED A TECH EQUIPMENT CHECK OUT LIBRARY FOR AREA STUDENTS

In response to the Coronavirus pandemic, Thrive created an equipment checkout system for participating Design Crew students. These 10 new Apple laptop computers made possible by the Walton Family Foundation are creative industry standard and enable students to tinker with the Adobe Creative suite at home outside of workshop hours. Because of these laptops, Thrive was able to provide a Squarespace website building workshop in June that allowed for adequate space between students at our office in Downtown, Helena.
